We launched our 2018 Professional Learning Program with a wonderful twilight presentation on 6 February from one of Australia's leading research Fellows at the Centre for Community Child Health here in Melbourne. Dr Tim Moore addressed the significance of the first thousand days of life on future health and developmental outcomes. This ground-breaking research, ['The First Thousand Days: An Evidence Paper'](#), published by Dr Moore and his colleagues at the Murdoch Children's Research Institute, charts the key scientific discoveries that unlock some of the mysteries surrounding the processes by which genes, experiences and environments interact to influence development.

The presentation was attended by a wide range of participants, many of whom accessed the event via videoconferencing and live-streaming from rural areas of Victoria, interstate and from as far afield as New Zealand. 
